Training objectives:

During the training, the educators and assistants will receive the tools to implement the "Krembo Kindergarten" program in the kindergarten as an educational program. At each meeting, the teams will experience the activity sets, get to know the program materials, and take part in active peer learning.

Program Content:

- Strengthening the sense of belonging of children with and without disabilities in an integrated social group.
- Raising awareness of the needs and differences of the other without emphasizing its abnormality.
- Recognizing and emphasizing the uniqueness of each child, from an understanding of the strengths of the individual in order to build an integrative community in which there is an active place for each boy and girl.



Kindergarten assistants, integraters in kindergartens and schools.

General Information:

The role of the assistants and integrators in the educational system is crucial. Beyond being part of the overall educational and professional staff, they are an emotional and inclusive resource for the children. They are comforting and inclusive figures for the children and emotional, social, and behavioral responses to their needs. The assistants and integrators accompany the children at a critical age in their development. Enhance, this educational role requires training and digging into the world of the child.

Program Content:

- Psychological theories in child development.
- Communication with children.
- Teamwork and interpersonal communication.
- Organization of the educational environment.
- Dealing with difficulties in caring for and educating children.
- · Parental Involvement in Education.
- Becoming familiar with the world of disabilities.
- The role of games in the child's life is a tool for building the child's belonging in the social circle.

Following the law for the adequate representation of people with disabilities in the workplace, the training aims to provide tools and knowledge that will help with the integration of an employee with disabilities. The preparation of staff, the social and technical implementations requirements from the workplace, and all the necessary skills for creating 'belonging' and 'inclusion' in the workplace.

Program Content:
